

My name is Jordan Myran, sister of Mercedes Myran. The day of December 1, 2022 replays over in my head to this day. One of the worst days of my life. The day the police told me that man had taken my sister's life. The day my family's lives changed forever.

Me, my sister Brandy and my sister Mercedes were all very close growing up. We loved to shop, go on adventures and just be around each other. It breaks my heart that she was taken from us and I no longer have my big sister anymore.

I know the pain all too well of losing a mother at a young age, and my heart breaks for my sister's children Mackenzie and Titan. My nephew has woken up and cried in my arms asking for his Mommy. How are you supposed to tell an eight-year-old his mom is never coming home?

Mackenzie, my niece misses her Mom. She always asks me questions about her mommy. She has gotten close to me because I told her I lost my Mom when I was eight-years-old. I understand her pain and what she is going through. Thank goodness we all have our grandmothers to support us.

It is bad enough you murdered my sister. Then you raped and dismembered her and placed her in garbage bags. Next, you throw her into the garbage bin like old trash. Mercedes was not trash. She is a mother, daughter, sister, aunt, granddaughter, and a good friend. Mercedes was loved by all. You had no right to do what you did. My sister did not deserve this. I hope your sentencing keeps you locked up for what you did to these women and that you never have the opportunity to hurt anyone again.
